In the email text of last months COGVA News, I requested prayer for my coming trip to Pakistan. As this issue of COGVA News finds it's way

into your mailbox, I should be wheels down in Multan Airport in Pakistan. I should have arrived by 4:30 EDT pm on October 31. From there, the ministry team will travel to Jahania, the sites of where we will be able to preach to a yet undetermined number of people.

Some have asked, "Why are you making this trip?" Most have been supportive, even if they have expressed their trepidation concerning this venture. I am grateful for that support and encouragement. THANK YOU!

Many years ago, farther back than I care to imagine, the Lord, for whatever reasons unbeknownst to me, placed a ministerial call on my life. I struggled with that call for a variety of reasons. Some from a sense of unworthiness, and some resulting from physical inability. When I finally got serious about my ministerial call, being challenged by the preaching of Gerald Yates in a camp meeting in central Illinois, a portion of by prayer of submission was that if God had really called me to ministry, He would open the doors He would have me enter and close the ones to where I was not to be. I have used this as a guide for my ministry ever

since and it has served me well. As a result, I find myself many miles from the place I knew as home as I serve the Lord here in Virginia, my current home.

For the last 10 years or so, I have had a relationship with a congregation in Jahania. Pastor and I talk often, and he translates sermons preached via the internet to the same church each Friday morning. They are a small congregation meeting in his home, but other area pastors have been attending as well, and it has been their desire for the mission trip upon which I have embarked to take place. In addition to preaching, I will be fulfilling the request to come and speak with pastors about the need for continued education in any form they can receive it.

This venture is not the first attempt. Pastor and I had made plans and had most funds raised for a missions trip in 2020. Do you remember that year? I do. Not only is it the year COVID struck, it is also the year that the mission now taking place had been cancelled. All funds for travel and site maintenance for our gathering was channeled a different direction so that food and medicine could be provided for our sister church in Jahania. Now, all obstacles seem to have been removed, and doors have opened where I never thought possible, and living up to my commitment, as you read this, I expect to find myself walking through the latest door of ministry that has been swung open seemingly by God Himself and God alone.

How to pray for me? First, let's make sure we understand this trip is not about me, except in the understanding it is an attempt to fulfil the entire call to ministry the Lord placed (Continued on page 6)

## CHOGAFFIRM.COM And What it Means to the Local Congregation

There has been a lot of talk lately about the CHOGaffirm.com website. Their original statement is, "THE AFFIRMATION OF LGBTQ+ PEOPLE, AND THE FREEDOM OF CONSCIENCE FOR ALL BELIEVERS WITHIN THE CHURCH OF GOD".

They further state, "There is a strong biblical, theological, and ethical case for affirming same-sex partnerships, transgender identity and existence, and gender non-conformity as being fully compatible with Christian discipleship and the theological and doctrinal distinctives of the Church of God Reformation Movement.", and, "Ministers and lay people in the Church of God must have the freedom of conscience to affirm gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and queer Christians in their lives, partnerships, and ministerial callings.". Their final demand is that, "Gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and queer Christians must be welcomed and recognized as full participants in the life and ministry of the Church of God at all levels.".

Well, I do partially agree with them when they say, "All people are sacred and beloved, created in the image of God.". They even have that statement three times on the front page of their website.

Their statement, "There is a strong biblical, theological, and ethical case for

affirming same-sex partnerships, transgender identity and existence, and gender non-conformity as being fully compatible with Christian discipleship and the theological and doctrinal distinctives of the Church of God Reformation Movement.", can only be true if they have done what I call, "Torn pages out of the Bible".

Speaking of the Bible, they make all of those claims but do not produce ANY Biblical reference to support any of their claims.

The Church of God in Virginia (COGVA) is very concerned about this group of people and the effect they may have on the people attending Church of God congregations and our National Offices. There are more than 800 signatures included to support their stand. The people who signed in support include 39 people who identifies themselves as "doctors". What is even more disturbing is there are 49 people who refer to themselves as "Reverend".

So less than 1,000 signatures are a relatively small number of people compared to the number of people attend Church of God congregations. However, many of the professors at our flagship university, Anderson University, are signatures and they are teaching this philosophy within the classrooms there.

Here at Water's Edge Church (WEC) in Virginia Beach, we have considered issues like these for years. Right before the COVID-19 pandemic emerged, we were in the process of revising the way we identified the Christians who attended our congregation. Since our congregation was formed nearly fifty years ago, (Continued on page 7)

(CHOGAFFIRM.COM Continued) we defined "voting members" of our congregation, in a very simple way:

1. They would self-declare that they were a Christian. and

2. If they were at least 16 years old. and

3. If they had attended WEC regularly during the past 6 months. then

4. They would be a voting member of WEC and could legally vote for or against anything within our congregation.

That has now all changed. Our congregation recently voted to change our acceptance criteria. Now the process of becoming a "Voting Member" is as follows:

1. They must attend each of the 4 onehour classes where the following is discussed:

a. Our Statement of Faith

b. Our Abiding Together at WEC document

c. Why someone should commit to a Local Church

d. An Overview of WEC and its history

2. A potential member will then complete an application.

3. A personal interview (or more properly called, a gospel conversation) will be done with a current Elder of WEC.

4. During this conversation, they must describe who Jesus is, they must confess that they are a Christian, they must agree

with our Statement of Faith and Abiding Together documents.

5. A writeup of that interview will be submitted to the other elders for their review.

6. If all goes well, the Elder Board will recommend the person to the congregation.

7. The congregation will have the opportunity to confirm them at the next quarterly Members' Meeting.

This new procedure prevents those who believe these "alternate lifestyles" are compatible with Christianity from becoming voting members of our congregation.

This is because our Statement of Faith clearly states it is incompatible with standards clearly defined within the Bible.

The reason for our change is because by using our old method, we would have to affirm LGBTQ+ individuals if they are older than 16 years of age, say they are a Christian and have been with us for more than 6 months.

If the Bylaws or Constitution of your congregation allow something similar to what ours previously required, I sincerely ask you to make a safeguarding change to those legal documents. If desired, I will help any congregation perform this transformation.
