There is a story of a Christmas pageant where three small children were to play the part of the wise men. At the appropriate time, the actors were to kneel and give to the baby Jesus and His parents their gifts. The first

knelt before the manger and said, "From a very far country, we present this gift of gold." The second actor, in a moment of stage fright forgot his lines, but was rescued by the third actor who quickly stepped in like a professional, and bore his gift, saying, "My king from where I come has given the incense of Myrrh." Knowing all eyes were now on him to say his part and present his gift, the second child knelt before the manger and family and confidently declared, "Frank sent this!"

Send in the ... Magi!

The presence of the Magi in Jesus' day has always intrigued me. Most nativity scenes and Christmas pageants present them as if they were there the night of Jesus' birth, but a careful reading of the scripture reveals it may have been up to two years before the Magi show up at the home of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus. Rather than a visit to a stable to see a babe in a manger, most translations of scripture identify the wise men as coming into the house and presenting gifts of whose implications vary more than this short article can afford. Not much is revealed about these men, other than they "came from the east". Their ultimate goal and destination was to worship this King. Their trek took them through Herod's court where the insecurities of those to whom power had been given gave way to weak-minded thinking that resulted in the massacre of innocent children throughout Bethlehem and all its districts. These wise men, as scripture refers to them, were well read enough in the now Old Testament to grasp the prophecies foretold there.

It would seem one of the purposes of the Magi was to provide a set of gifts to the Christ child and His family for that which would happen once Herod realized the wise men were not coming back with word about the location of the one, they sought to worship. Each of the three gifts listed in scripture would have been easily transitioned into provisions that would have made an exilic home in Egypt possible. In short, the wise men provided gifts that secured the presence of Christ in a world/society bent on His destruction. In every generation, God has provided people of great wisdom. In a time when the church had become apostate, seeking her own wealth and power rather than the sweet presence of the Holy Spirit, God raised up a man named Martin Luther, who was bold enough to challenge the status guo of his day and declare, "The just shall live by faith" and not the man-made traditions of the church.

In another day, God raised two brothers named Charles and John Wesley to help us understand prevenient grace and entire sanctification.

Our own tribe has produced women and men like Nora Hunter, Arlo Newell, James Earl Massey, and others who have helped (Continued on page 6)

maintain the presence of Christ in this world through the presence of His church.

Nora Hunter was an early pioneer in the Church of God Reformation Movement who developed a passion for missions and entered the ministry at age nineteen. She would eventually become the founder and first president of the National Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society, now known as Christian Women's Connection. John W.V. Smith compiled some of her wisdom in his book, Herald's of a Brighter Day. "We who have seen the dawn must help others to see the Day Star." "Take root downward and bear fruit upward." "System, not spasm, is God's method." "There is only one way to make dreams come true; wake up and go to work." "Pain and disappointment sometimes cut channels into one's life deep enough for streams of living water to flow through to refresh thirsty souls." And "Coming together is a beginning, keeping together is progress, and working together is success."

James Earl Massey, a product of and leader within the church of God, was recognized in 2006 by Christianity today as one of the 25 most influential preachers of the previous 50 years. Writing for Christianity Today in 1995, Dr. James Earl Massey wrote about the racial climate in the United States. "Today a new historical moment is upon our churches to stand against attitudes that polarize and demonize. The church is armed with valid ethical claims and the means to deal positively with a diverse population that challenges those still tainted by the heresy that race and skin color is a measure of human worth. The quest for a reasoned Christian approach to our nation's needs might be long and costly, but it will lead to

our salvation as a people." James Earl Massev

Concerning the unity of the Church, Dr. Massey said this: "The doctrines of the Christian holiness and unity must be seriously taught again and become our core beliefs. Core beliefs inform. shape, motivate. and determine behavior." African Americans and the Church of God.

Arlo Newell stated, "Life in the church (is) changing, requiring that we walk by faith, knowing that Christ is Lord we can trust the future in his hands. When one has "seen the church," as Merle Strege has written: we realize that it is not an organization but a spiritual organism empowered by the Holy Spirit. Having seen the church and knowing that Christ is Lord, we live in anticipation as inevitable changes take place...... (We are often faced) with temptations to make life in the Spirit so bland it has little or no meaning to personal conduct, or, we make it so legalistic that it is a negative factor in one's faith. Each generation must discover afresh that it is "not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, saith the Lord" (Zech. 4: 6 KJV). Our people wait for a clear voice on balanced, practical, rational, sanctified living. In reality, this is the "Life" in the church." -Arlo Newell in "Life in the Church I stand with Arlo Newell in his declaration that we wait for a clear voice in this current generation. Clarity and wisdom may be found in a variety of places, but it is my hope and prayer that some coming after me might be able to say of those in my generation, there were wise people there. Just as in the days of Jesus early life, there were those who sought him, made it possible for the gospel message to live on and thrive to the next generation.




