



Thirteen years ago, almost to the day, I watched as my little girl was inhaled by the open mouth on the side of a large yellow monster that bore the name of our local public school district.

That yellow monster was

driven by a man my little girl came to know and love, who carried her off to a school where her teachers likewise earned my daughter's respect, admiration, and love. Abby was so excited to run up the stairs of that bus, make new friends, and explore the world school had to offer. She still carries that same excitement for learning and meeting new people, thus continuing to broaden her horizons.

As her daddy, on the other hand, I was not so enamored with this idea of seeing her gone from my sight for so long a time. I remember that day well. I spent it in the office praying for my girl. Truth be told, I did a bit of pacing in the church. I kept the phone handy for the purpose of rescuing my girl from whatever it might be that put her on edge, or caused her to conclude, "I want my Daddy." That call never came from the school that day, but I have heard that cry in other settings not conducive to this writing. Throughout that school day, I longed for that call, but, alas and

again, it never came. In the afternoon, I found a place to sit on the corner where, at the appointed time, that same yellow monster would meander back down the street from which it had earlier journeyed, pause at the same place where it breathed in my daughter, and allow a very happy little girl to exit, run to her daddy, and spend the next few hours telling me all about the things kindergarten had to offer.

Recently, I was given the assignment of delivering a sermon with the same title as this article.

No small task, when you think about the varied ideas, opinions and theological perspectives concerning the

content of this book of the Bible. Revelation can be intimidating, anxiety-inducing, and stressful to think about and discuss.

We come across phrases like *post-millennialism*, *amillennialism*, and my personal favorite... *pre-tribulational premillennialism*... And it seems, the further in you wade, the more overwhelming it all can become.

There is only one reason to be nervous about Revelation and related events. If you don't know Christ as your Lord and savior, you ought to be worried.

I don't want to simply give you what the Church of God believes about the Revelation of Christ and events related to His second coming... I want to give you what I believe the **Bible** tells us, as simply as I can.

Lastly, and this is the key thing for us to remember: There is hope for the church in all that she goes through and endures... There is victory ahead for us.


In short, the fight is fixed, and the end has already been declared, decided, and won.

triumph belongs to the people of God, so long as they ARE still the people of God!

The Revelation is given to us, not so we can try to predict, and speculate about the events of His second coming, but so that we could view our history- past, present, and future, considering the final outcome.

If we were to view the events of our human history, without the lens of scripture, and the events of Revelation, we would indeed, be a sad people. But with Revelation, and its declaration of the church's final victory, we can persevere now, because of God's victory for His people, already promised and secured! We need firm hope and the expectation of God doing what He said and drawing it all to a victorious close on this side of heaven, to anchor ourselves to. Revelation establishes the Lord as Alpha & Omega, holy, mighty, and worthy of our praise. Time began with God and it'll end with Him, too. It all started with Him forming creation, and introducing us into it, and it will end with Him unraveling it and removing us from it... Powerful Creator in the beginning, Conquering King in the end.

In His book, *“Revelation: Leaving Speculation Behind,”* Tim Dwyer gives a list of 10 things that Revelation teaches, and I have chosen 3 of those things to base the next 3 points from. (What We Believe... Continued) few practical things to bear in mind about what Revelation should encourage us to focus on!

### 3 Big Ideas:

#### 1. Revelation Encourages us to live a life of holiness:

Despite many popular ideas surrounding the events of the second coming, I believe scripture makes a few things abundantly clear to you and I:

When He comes... It won't happen quietly or in secret. It will be unmistakable. You won't need a newspaper headline or Facebook post to inform you. Scripture is clear that you won't miss it when it happens...

**Revelation 1:7** tells us plainly that, *"He is coming with clouds, and every eye will see Him, even those who pierced Him, and all the tribes of earth will wail on account of Him. Even so. Amen."* **1<sup>st</sup> Thessalonians 4:16** likewise describes a shout, as the Lord HIMSELF descends from Heaven, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trump of God...

When scripture says, in **Revelation 16:15**, *"Behold I am coming like a thief,"* I don't believe this is telling us *how* He will come... But how quickly He will come! Like a thief who comes into a home, gets what He's seeking and gets out!

Christ will not tarry. It'll happen fast.

Given that information, alongside this truth from **Matthew 24:36**, *"But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only..."* This

ought to encourage us and motivate us toward lifestyles of holiness—It should prompt us to live like Jesus and model His character. Because there will ultimately come a day when it is too late for you and I to do so. No extra chances after that moment.

Nobody knows when, and when it happens... It will happen quickly!

**NOW** is always the best time to get right with Him, and pursue the things He tells us are good!

As the song says, "Be ready when He comes!"

#### 2. Revelation encourages us to evaluate your heart:


Most people—not all, but well over half, of the people I talk to, who don't go to church at all, or don't go regularly enough, want to mention the anti-Christ. Looking for a single, charismatic person, who works their way into some notable position with a wide audience, and an enormous sphere of influence... and everyone thinks they know who it is. **A lot thought it was Obama, others suggested Trump...**

In her book, *"The Symbols Speak,"* by our own Lillie McCutcheon, she writes, *"Rather than speculate and add more confusion, it will be best to let the Bible itself identify antichrist. It may be surprising to learn that only one author in scripture gives any mention of antichrist and that very briefly. It is difficult to conceive how the imagination could create such a wide variety of myths from only four short texts of scripture."*

(What We Believe... Continued) Only 4 texts make mention of the anti-Christ... (1 John 2:18, 1 John 2:22, 1 John 4:3, and 2 John 7...)

Revelation encourages us to be careful who and what we worship and place our faith in, because, rather than looking for a person to fear, or someone to be worried about, *antichrist* sounds more like an attitude or mindset we are prone to participate in, by denying to live holy lives, and pursuing lesser things that Christ intended for us.

Lillie would write, just a few paragraphs later, *“According to John’s identification of antichrist, it is an inclusive term applied to all persons or religious beliefs lying, denying, and deceiving concerning who Jesus really is. When you add crime, drug addiction, murder, illegitimate sex, drunkenness, abuse, and the entire catalog of sins you see the battle we really fight is against sin, and Satan.*

At some point, we were all anti-Christ... Lost in sin, rebelling against God... But he saved us from that. But occasionally... if we aren’t careful, focused with our attention on **Him**... if we are committed to holiness... Do you think we can slip back into that?

Jeremy Dunn did some phenomenal teaching and preaching on Holiness during our State Campmeeting. He mentioned two kinds of holiness—**Imparted**, or the holiness we get when we are saved. Something God grants us... but he also mentioned **Progressive holiness**... which is the type of holiness we grow into, as we daily seek to be more like Christ. Taking

on more HIS character, while taking off our old.

I would submit to you today, based on those scriptures in 1+2 John, that holiness is how we avoid becoming *antichrist*, and how we avoid any resemblance to those people who are. To avoid the mark of the enemy, and to become an overcomer, as Revelation encourages us to be, we must set our sights on looking like Jesus, and dwelling on the things He tells us are good things. Rather than being caught up in the things of the world, which is largely antichrist itself, would have us pursue.

### 1. Revelation Encourages us to be ready now, for judgement then:

When He returns, there will be no weeks or months leading up to you presenting your case before the Lord. There will be no time to hire a defense team, there will be no chance retrial...

When that time comes and earth dissolves and time is no more, you will find yourself before Him- the God of heaven... Equally a loving Father and a wrathful judge.

**2nd Peter 3:10** says, *“But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed.”*

Everything we know and everything we are just discovering, from earth’s deepest ocean, to the furthest reaches of the James Webb Space telescope... will be burned (Continued on page 12)



And We have a choice to make. Not then, on that day... but today. Right now:


